## Public FAQs - Energy Ambassadors Programme

## 1. What is the Energy Ambassadors Programme (EAP)?

The EAP, launched by the Energy Market Authority (EMA), aims to identify students with a keen interest in energy-related issues, and to sustain their enthusiasm by involving them in sector-wide outreach events. This is part of EMA's effort to create and nurture a group of like-minded individuals who possess strong enthusiasm and interest to contribute to the Energy sector.

## 2. What is the commitment level of this programme?

Singaporean students who are appointed will serve as Energy Ambassadors for two years. Energy Ambassadors can look forward to participating in a series of outreach events which are organised to share with students more on the developments in the sector. These include events such as <a href="Youth@SIEW">Youth@SIEW</a> and <a href="Youth@SIEW">Powering Lives Trails</a> (learning journeys).

Energy Ambassadors who participate in at least 5 outreach events during their two-year stint will receive Certificates of Participation to recognise their contributions.

# 3. If I am appointed as an Energy Ambassador, will there be training provided?

Trainings and briefings will be provided to ensure that Energy Ambassadors are able to represent the sector and be well-equipped for your role.

## 4. How do I apply for the EAP?

# 5. When is the EAP application period?

Applications are now open till 31 July 2018.

#### 6. How will I be notified about the application outcome?

Shortlisted applications will be notified via email by end September 2018.

# 7. I am a polytechnic student and my course of study is not in engineering. Can I still apply?

Energy Ambassadors should preferably be/will be pursuing relevant Energy-sector related engineering courses (e.g. electrical, mechanical). If you possess a strong interest for the Energy sector, we will consider your application on a case-by-case basis.

# 8. I am only a secondary school student. Am I too young? What can I contribute?

No, you are not too young. We welcome students who have a keen interest in the Energy sector to be more involved through their physical participation in industry events. As long as you have background in science, we will consider your application on a case-by-case basis.

# 9. How does this benefit me? Does this help with my job search, scholarship application in future?

Through your participation in sectorial outreach events, ambassadors will gain valuable exposures outside of classrooms learning. The networking opportunities would be useful as you would be kept up to date of energy trends that may aid your future career and scholarship applications. The Certificate of Participation at the end of your two-year stint can also help to supplement and enhance your resume.
